

2010 Accounting High School Residency Program @ UGA (ARP)

What is the Accounting High School Residency Program?

The Accounting High School Residency Program (ARP) is designed to provide an introduction and overview of the many career opportunities in the world of accounting. It not only introduces students to accounting, but also gives a view on what to expect in college.

When is the Accounting High School Residency Program?

The ARP dates are June 27-30, 2010 at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia. The application deadline for receipt of all materials is Monday, May 3, 2010.

What can I expect at the Accounting High School Residency Program?

Students will attend sessions during the day and have nightly activities. Sessions include presentations from representatives of national, regional, and local accounting firms, industry, and government to illustrate the job opportunities and careers available in accounting. Other sessions include how to write a resume, real world ethics, business etiquette, financial literacy, and leadership skills. Students also get a taste of “college life” by living in the dorms, walking to classes and eating in the University of Georgia dining halls.

Who is eligible to attend the program?

- High School students residing in the state of Georgia who have not previously attended this program or the GSCPA High School Residency Program.
- Students must be scheduled to complete their sophomore, junior or senior year of high school in May or June 2010.
- Students must be on the college bound track for graduation.

How much does the program cost?

There is a \$50 participation fee for all students who attend. The remaining cost of the program is covered by company sponsors. A limited number of need-based scholarships will be available.

What is the selection process?

- Students will be selected based on academic record and extracurricular activities.
- Grade Point Average and PSAT/SAT/ACT scores will also be considered in the selection process.
- One letter of recommendation from a guidance counselor or teacher is required (form attached).
