If a student is absent, it is his/her responsibility to obtain the necessary notes/work. Upon return, students should discuss missed work with the instructor.

Work Ethic Grade It takes more than creativity to

be successful It takes good work habits. For this reason, students will be given a daily work ethic grade as part of this course. This work ethic grade will account for 10% of the overall grade. Each student has the opportunity to earn 4 points per day. A total of 348 points can be earned by the end of each semester. Students will earn one point each day for the following ...

Any student with an average of 74 or below at the end of the 6 or 12 week grading period may be eligible for a recovery plan designed to provide an additional opportunity for mastery of the course objectives. It is the student's responsibility to request a recovery plan from the instructor. The components of recovery are listed below.

- 1. All assigned work must be completed in order for a student to be eligible for recover. (i.e., no zeros in the grade book.)
- 2. Students should make an appointment to request recovery by completing and submitting a "Request for Recovery" form to the teacher within three (3) days of learning of the 74 or below grade.
