What to shoot?	First, choose a social issue to concept or illustrate within your images and resear this issue.
	Then, Individually, you need to shoot 15-20 images. Choose your best two to cr ate a series. Manipulate these images using displacement maps.
	Really think about your composition when you're shooting. The composition will a dominant factor in making your audience understand your point of view on the chosen social issue. Also, determine the best <i>lighting situation (dark/light), depti</i> of field (shallow/deep), motion techniques (if necessary), close up or far away, point of view.
	The camera should be set on manual settings: manual mode you will decide on the shutter speed, aperture and ISO that best suits yo available lighting
What to turn in?	All images should be cleaned up and color corrected. Series (of 2 images) should be manipulated using displacement maps.
