Advanced Placement Practice Exams





Georgia Virtual School is please to offer students in Georgia access to Advanced Placement Practice Exams to help them prepare for the College Board AP® exams administered in May of each year.

The questions on these Practice Exams were written by Georgia AP® teachers in the same style and format as those found on the real AP® exams. Each exam has a multiple choice and a free-response section set to the actual time allowed by the College Board. Students receive feedback on the questions and may take the exams as many times as they wish.

Additionally the Practice Exams have flashcards students can use to practice key vocabulary terms as well as hints and strategies for tackling the multiple choice and free response sections.

Students who enrolled in GAVS AP® courses Fall 2008 and Spring 2009 with a practice exam will not need to register for them. The practice exams will be available to them through their GAVS course(s).


Registering for the Practice Exams

Beginning March 1, students will be able to register for the Advanced Placement Practice Exams at the Georgia Virtual School website: www.gavirtualschool.org.


Once on the home page, click on the link at the top that says Registration.

Students who do not already have a Georgia Virtual School account should create a log in by choosing the option to create a GAVS account.

Students should click the link that says Create an Account on the log in box. Then complete the information on the form. They will need to verify their email address. Be sure they enter it correctly, check their email, and then come back to the website and log in again.

Registering for the AP® Practice Exam


Once students have verified their email addresses by logging back into their accounts, beginning on March 1, they should choose the last option:

Enrolling in an AP Practice Course

Then they will be directed to choose from the following 10 subject-area practice exams.

AP Computer Science A
AP English Language
AP Calculus AB
AP Macroeconomics
AP Psychology
AP US Government
AP US History
AP World History
AP Chemistry
AP Physics B

Students may register for more than one subject area practice exam. Once students register it takes 24-48 hours for them to be moved to their practice exam.



Frequently Asked Questions

Will teachers be able to access the AP® Practice Exams?

Regretfully teachers cannot create logins to access the AP® practice exams. There are a very limited number of spaces and we have reserved all of these for student use. However, students are free to show teachers the resources they are using in their practice course.

How long will students have access to the materials?

Students will be able to access their Practice Exams from March 1st through May 30th. Students will need to wait 24-48 hours after they register to gain access to their practice exam.

Do all the resources need to be used in one sitting?

No. Students will have access to all the features through May 30. Students may take the practice exams more than one time. Each time a student takes a section of the practice exam, the questions and answer choices will be randomly shuffled to a new order.

Will students receive a grade or a score on the practice exam?

Students will learn which questions they answered correctly and which ones they missed. Each question has detailed feedback to help students understand why the right answer choice is correct. Students will see a percentage of the questions they answered correctly but their score is not calculated to account for the ¼ point penalty assessed by College Board for wrong answers.
