## **Study Guide Questions**

Note: Setting, both historical and geographical, is an important aspect of this novel. It would be a good idea to look at a map to locate the countries and cities that are mentioned in the story.

## **CHAPTER ONE**

This chapter is very brief, but it establishes several important points:

- The story is told in *first person point of view*.
- The present time in which the *narrator* is speaking when the book begins is December 2001.
- This part of the novel is *retrospective*, that is, the narrator is looking back to an earlier time in his life.
- Three important *settings* are introduced.
- Three important *characters* (in addition to the narrator) are introduced.
- The *theme* of guilt ("my past of unatoned sins") is introduced.
- Kites (with their possible *symbolic* meaning) are mentioned.
